# National Honor Society

All students with a cumulative grade point average of three point five or better, for their academic work from the freshman to senior year, are eligible for the National Honor Society. The names are compiled by the guidance department and submitted to the faculty for approval. After they have been approved the students meet and vote on two scholarship applicants. They select the two on the basis of leadership, personality, and scholastic achievement. These students then submit applications for the National Honor Society Scholarships. The members of the National Honor Society this year selected Bridget King and Dale Schlais for the scholarship competition. The National Honor Society members also select the type of recognition they want. The members this year were honored on the senior awards day with the presentation of certificates and a pin. The night of graduation they wore a colored braid on the sleeve of their gowns and there was an asterisk by their names in the graduation bulletin signifying they are members of the National Honor Society.

This year we have also had two of our senior girls honored with scholarships outside of our school. We want them to know that we are proud of them and we wish them best of luck in their further education.

In the spring of every year an announcement is made for interested junior boys and girls to make application for Badger State. The guidance office screens the applicants and checks their personal records. Three boys and one girl are then selected. These students attend a one week convention, the girl at the University in Madison, and the boys at the University in Ripon. There they participate in a mock government, complete with campaigning, elections, and the passage of bills. This year, to the honor of Wausau West, Jim Zender was elected Governor.

Every spring mini-seminars are conducted by previous National Science Foundation Scholars, for the purpose of answering questions and interesting junior boys and girls. These students must choose one out of over one hundred different programs. At the beginning of every year, the general office compiles the cumulative grade point average of all present seniors. It is from these grade point averages that the class rankings are determined. The top forty-two students comprise the top ten per-cent, of which the top ten students get special recognition. These students are recognized in the graduation bulletin and they are also eligible for many scholarships and awards because of their high scholastic ranking. Sue Groethe topped our class during all four years. We also had a tie for sixth between Dave Kleinschmidt and Mike Krueger, so we don't have a seventh. Congratulations to all of these hard working students!

Every spring all students of the junior class have the opportunity to take the National Merit Qualifying Test on an appointed Saturday morning. In about a month after the test every student receives his or her test scores. It is from these percentile scores that students are commended and students selected as semi-finalists. This year we had three students receive letters of commendation and three students selected as semi-finalists. The semi-finalists then took another test to further qualify and all three of our semi-finalists were named finalists. Because of this, they were eligible to compete for many scholarships on the national level. Congratulations to you and good luck!

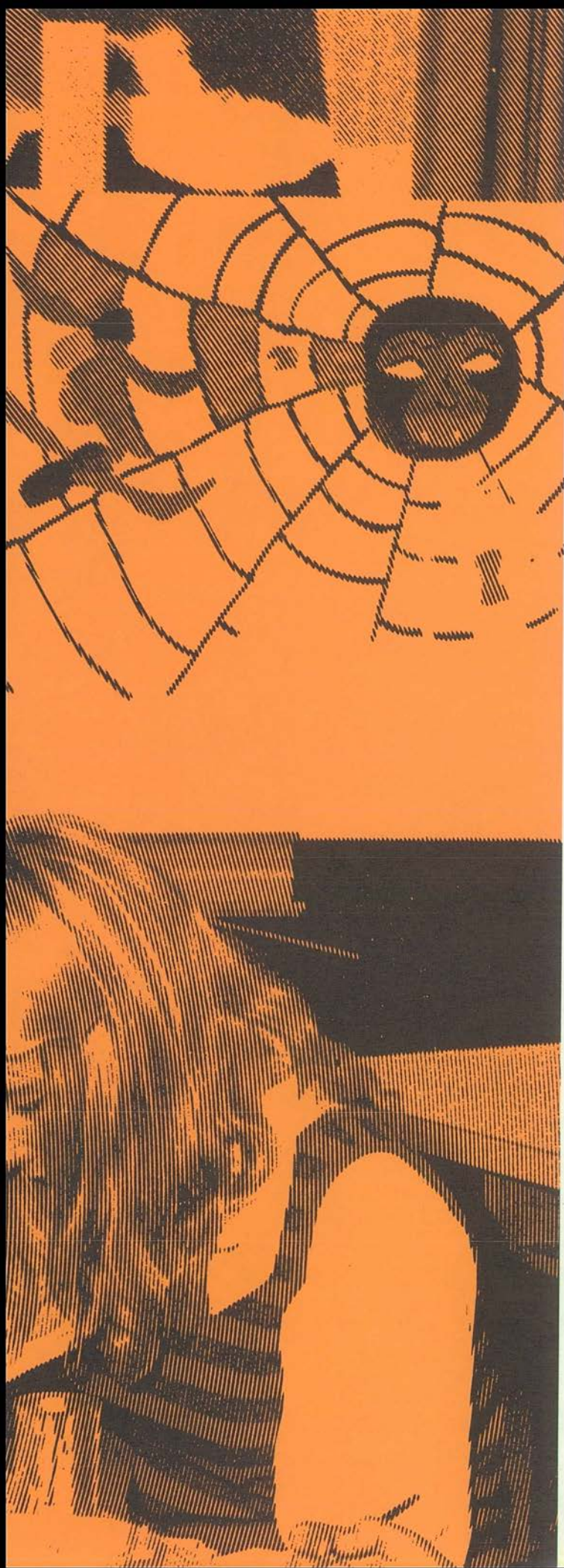



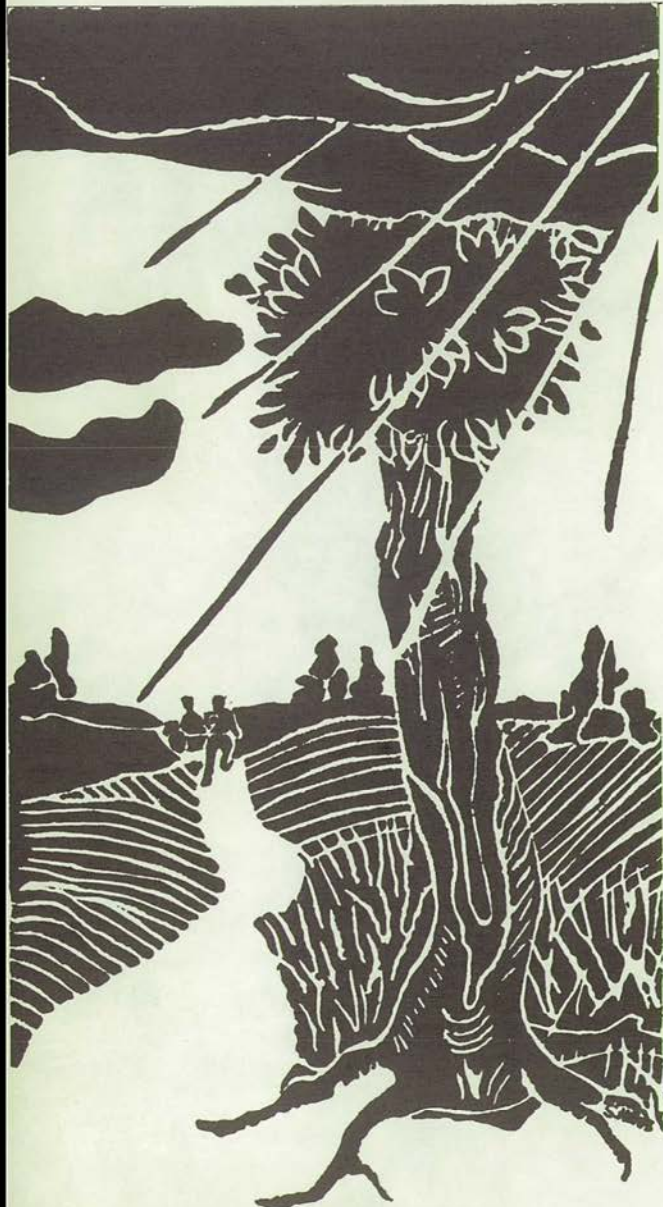
# WEST JAZZ BAND

Tina arrived in Wausau on August 13, 1971 and enrolled

as a senior, taking speech, typing, chemistry, original description and physical education the first semester. Her second semester classes consisted of exposition, sociology, typing, psychology, clerical practice and physical education. Mr. and Mrs. Ted Harenda are Tina's parents. Kim and Teri, who attend West, are her sisters, and Jeff and Tom, in grade school, her brothers.

Tina's stay with us will end on July 5, 1972. She says, "It is nice to be an A.F.S. student", but let her tell you herself.

To the students of Wausau West,

This year is something very special to me. It is a great experience that I will never forget.

While living in the United States I have had many experiences; attending classes that are different from the classes in Chile, seeing a snowfall for the first time, going to the football games and watching the cheerleaders yell. All these were new to me.

Before coming here, I thought I would find differences between my country and the United States, but I never suspected that I was going to find real love from a family, from friends and from a school.

Sometimes I compare my country to the U.S. and I see many differences between them; social, economic, geographic, political-but in the inside of the two countries I found young people with the same idea for the future and people who care about others.

Those of you who have known me well and have asked me "How do you like the U.S.A.?", "What is your country like?", you don't know how good you made me feel. It was nice to answer all those questions and to tell you about my country and myself. I think that after I return to my country, Chile will be more than just a country with five letters for the students that I met. To these students there will be a feeling of knowledge and understanding along with knowing the thoughts and love of a person from this country.

There is only one thing left to say to you: Thank you; thank you for everything, and don't forget me, because I will always remember you.

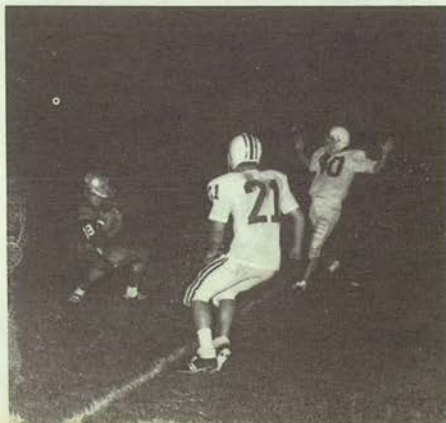

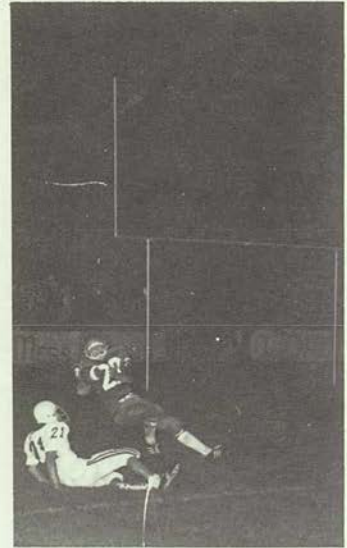

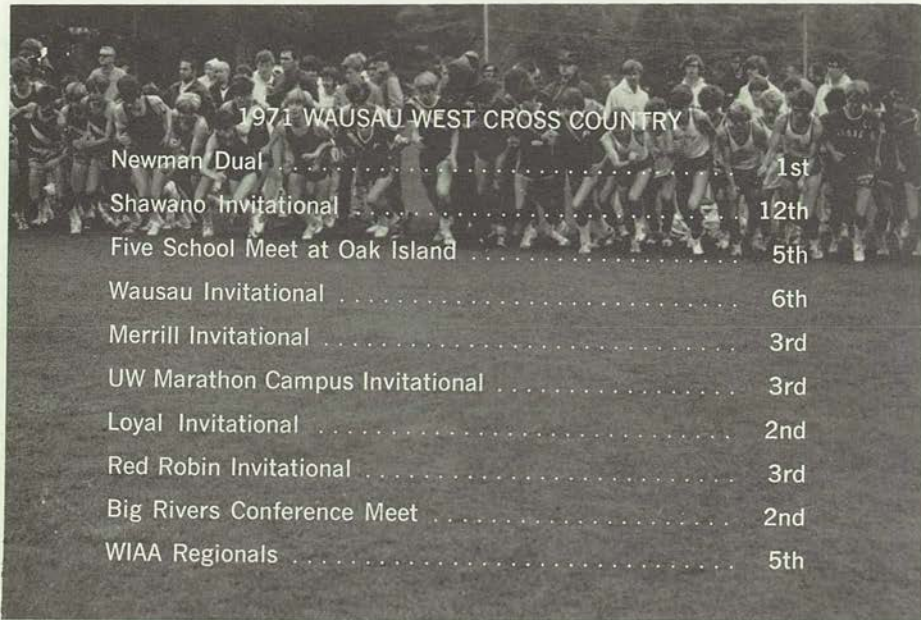

## Warriors Wrestle To Victory

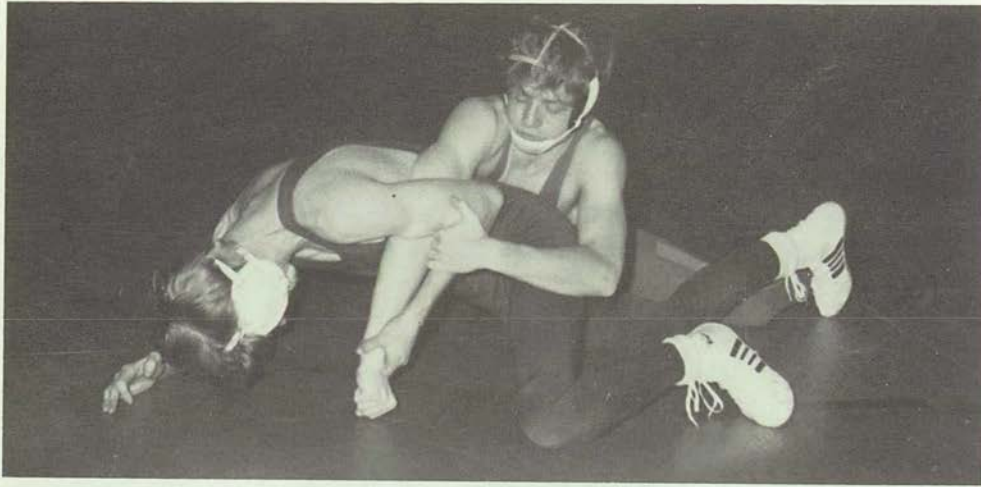

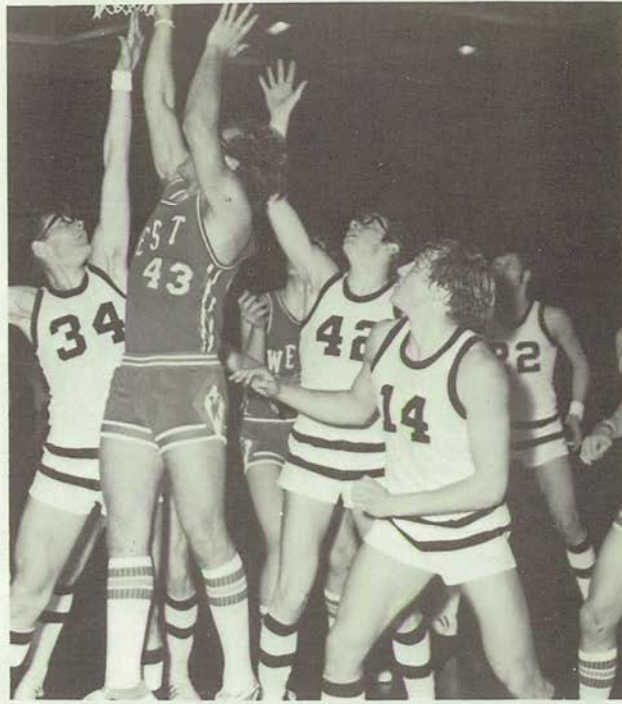

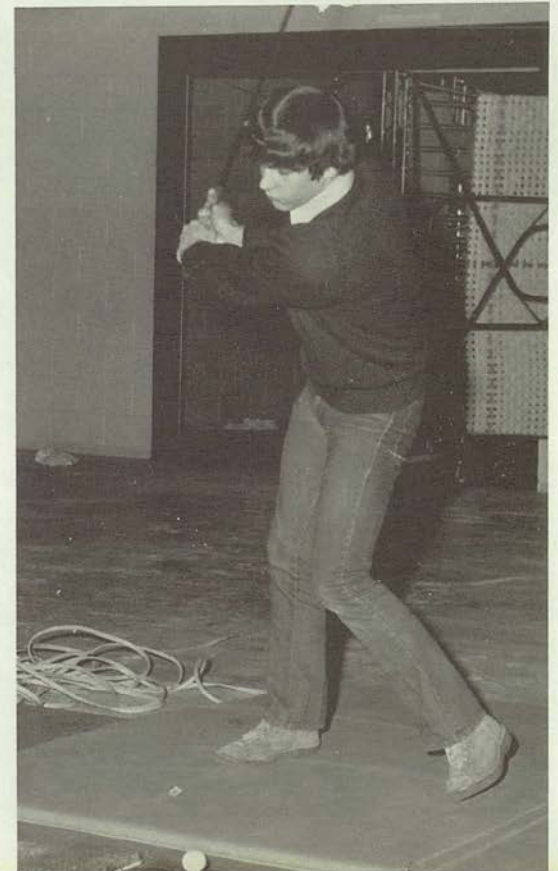

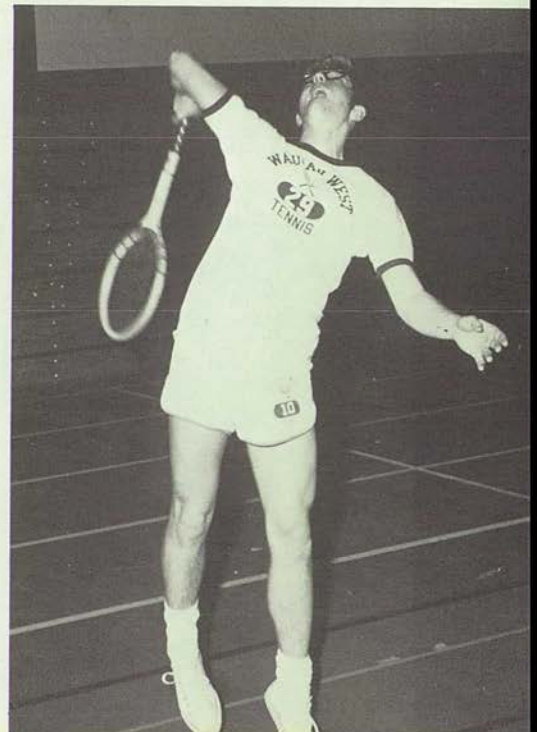

## Student Congress
