
### Homecoming


"The longest recorded basketball marathon was one of eighty-four hours by twenty-four girls and boys in Hertford, England."






## Cold Weather Limited





# "The Good Old Summertime"



Afterwards a Post Prom was held at the Wausau Club. The couples were served dinner and then danced or socialized to the beat of "Silver and Brass."
















#### Badger State

Uthrotar which stands for Youth Rotar is made up of senior boys chosen by the faculty. They are chosen on the basis of their grades, extra curricular activities and leadership qualities. Each Monday for a month, two of the boys attended the Rotary luncheon at the Wausau Club. At the meetings they listen to speakers and were recognized by the Rotarians.

Quill and Scroll is an international honorary society for high school journalists. Members must have been on either yearbook or paper publication staff for at least one year and are chosen for commendable work.

A faculty committee chooses interested students for Badger Girl's and Boy's State. These students must apply during their junior year.

Those chosen attend a workshop, sponsored by the American Legion and Auxiliary, for a week during the summer. They learn legislative procedures and participate in a mock government.

#### Seniors Earned Many Awards

D.A.R. GOOD CITIZEN is the Daughters of American Revolution Good Citizen Award. The senior class nominates girls and the faculty chooses the winner from the top three. The winner and her mother attend a tea in the spring which is held by the city's Daughters of the American Revolution in honor of the newly chosen Good Citizens.

The Kiwanis Club informs the high school when they wish a girl to be chosen for Girl of the Month. They send a list of qualifications which includes scholarship, leadership, personality and service to the school. With the aid of faculty suggestions, the guidance department chooses a girl. The winner is invited to a banquet and there receives a corsage and gold charm.

Students take the National Merit Scholarship test in their junior year. The students with the highest scores become semi-finalists They can then go on to take the Scholastic Apptitude Test. If they do well on this test they become a finalist. The parents of the finalists submit a Parent's Confidential Statement and the finalists may or may not receive a scholarship depending on their need.

Nancy Pearson is this year's Betty Crocker Homemaker of Tomorrow Award winner. She achieved this by scoring the highest on a test. The test is available to any senior girl whether or not she is interested in home economics. As a local winner, Nancy's test scores were submitted for state competition where she became the state award winner. State winners receive an all expense paid trip to Washington, D. C. for a week. In Washington there is competition on the national level.

Students in National Honor Society must have a 3.25 grade point average. They also must have the qualities of leadership, character, and service to the school. National Honor Society is a national organization. Students receive a pin for belonging and membership can be continued into the future.



student reach his potential. This was done through the new modular scheduling system which helped each teacher to work out a pattern of teaching best fitted to his beliefs and abilities.







The Wausau West swim team concluded their season with a six and six record overall. In conference meets the Warriors ended with a 3-4 record.




#### In 1971 Season


# Aurora Staff

# Colophon

Wausau West opened its doors, for the first time, in September, 1970 to approximately 1806 students from grades 9 to 12. 93 teachers met the students. Both students and faculty along with a sufficient number of administrators, secretarial and custodial staff looked forward to a formative year. The school, 267,647 square feet of building is situated on 40 acres of land at the end of West Wausau Avenue. Designed by John J. Flad and Associates of Madison and constructed by Hoffman Construction Company of Appleton, the building is a three-story academic unit connected on one side to the fieldhouse and commons area, on the opposite side to the auditorium and music departments.

Just as it is important to design a building suitable for an educational experience and teachers to create an atmosphere congenial for learning, it is the job of the yearbook staff to use a variety of materials and ideas to compile the story of one year.

The 1971 Aurora was printed in a limited edition of 1800 copies by the Fey Publishing Company of Wisconsin Rapids. Headline type was set in

24 pt. Venus Medium Extended on 196 pages of 80# ivory offset paper. End sheets were Rotunda Gold and all division pages employed black line conversion method. The cover, designed by the Aurora staff, was processed by the S. K. Smith Company of Chicago, Illinois and bound by National Bookbinding Company, Stevens Point. Underclass pictures were taken by Mr. Bush of National School Studios Inc. All action and group shots were compliments of Toburen's Studio
